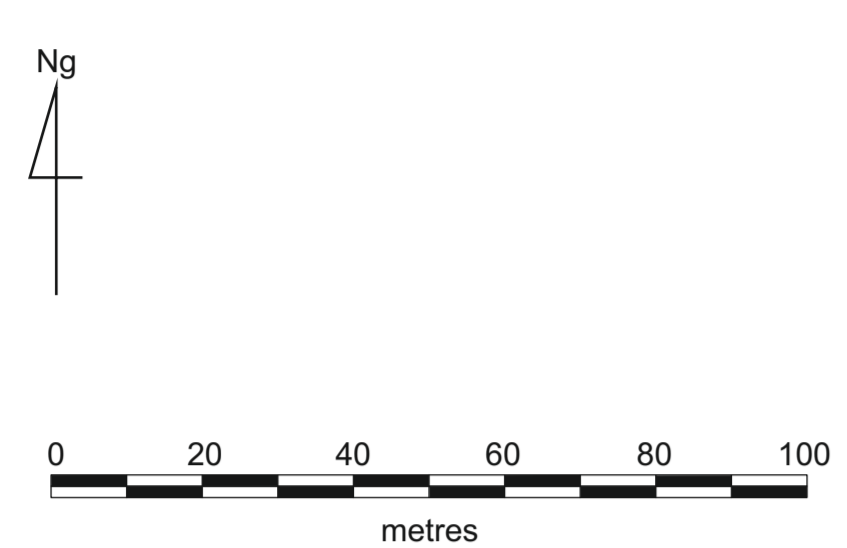


Entrance

- Notes
- (1) The connection the bottom entrance, Cueva Tiva, is currently blocked by domestic walls.
 - (2) Both the original Spanish survey (Cuadernos I) and the 1975 survey show a 40m long passage at this point.
 - (3) About 250m was surveyed in the Torca Series in 1975 but this still needs re-surveying.
 - (4) The pitch can be by-passed by dropping down a rift in the passage on the right. At the bottom, a stream can be followed to a cascade chamber and choke.
 - (5) The end of the passage could be dug to a continuation. At the base of the pit, there is a squeeze onto a second short pitch.
