

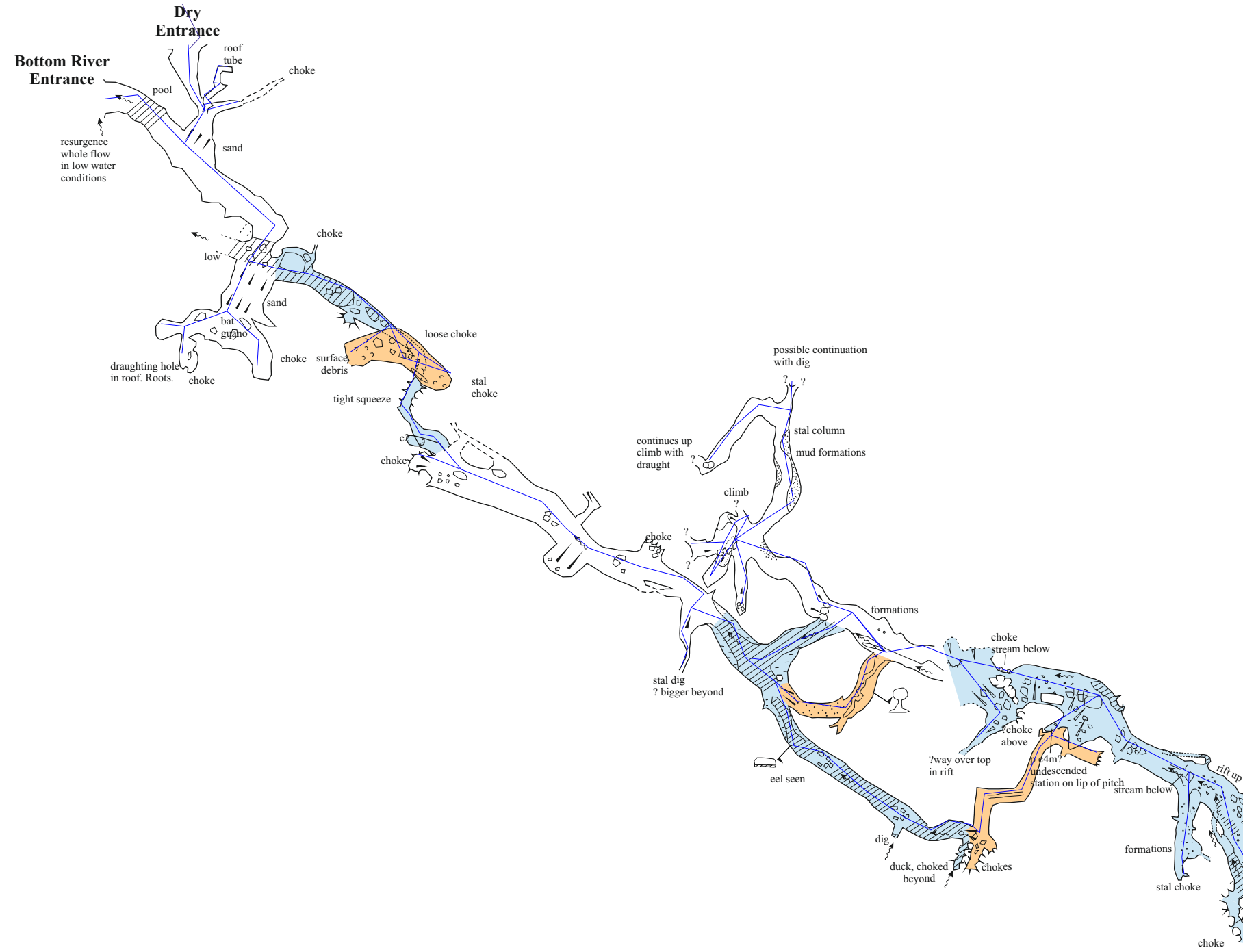

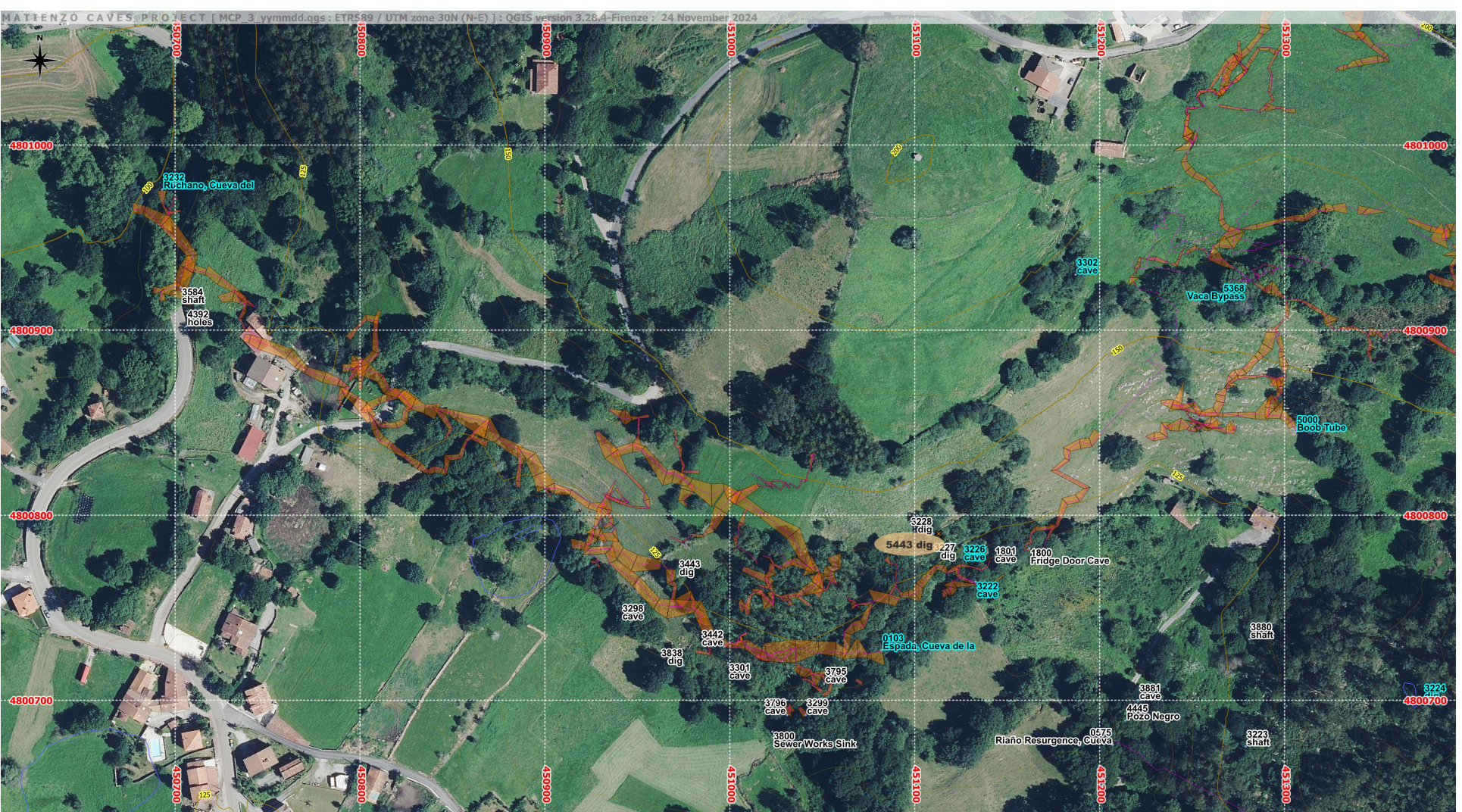
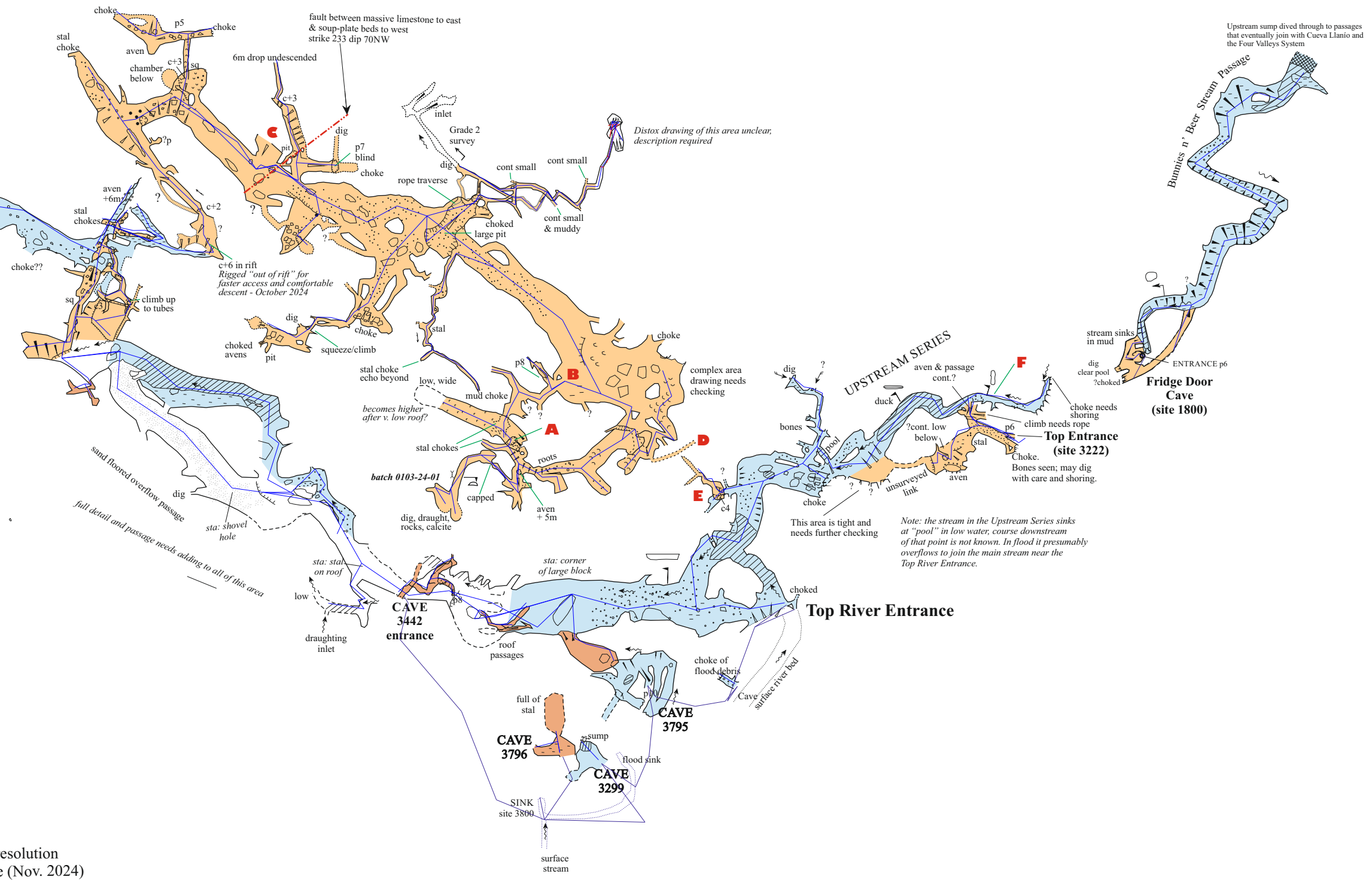
Fridge Door Cave (#1800) is linked into the Four Valleys System .

NOTES

- A** chimney (p+5, closes down after 3m).
- B** aven with boar, cow and other bones
- C** 2-bolt climb, 15 m, muddy and slippery in places to a wider top, but there is no way on. Lots of small stal in the roof.
- D** Excavated v. tight 15m draughting tube to a slope and hole 5m up. Exploration in 2024 suggested that other tubes may be in the area. There are many holes in the floor. (Not surveyed)
- E** Investigated 2024. One passage has draught excavated through mud and moonmilk, now requiring the floor excavating.
- F** In dry weather, water is seen bubbling up from under the wall. (Unknown tubular worms seen.) Upstream of this point has no flow.
